Children, grades K-6th grade, are welcome. There will be snacks, games, stories, crafts, worship & music.

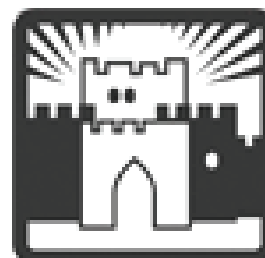

MISSIONS AND YOU

On the Road to a Rainbow of Opportunities

Have you ever wondered why we offer you so many opportunities to give to missions? The Nurture-Outreach-Witness (N.O.W.) committee would like to help you understand where we are coming from and hopefully where we are going in 2011.

Many years ago the Iowa Conference of The United Methodist Church created the Rainbow Covenant to help spread out Iowa UM Churches' mission giving over the rainbow's color spectrum. It also set three mile goals based on church membership (337 for St Luke in 2010.)

Mile One is given through our Apportionment dollars and based on a special formula so all churches participate equally. These funds go to a variety of ministries determined by the Iowa Annual Conference to 1) Iowa Conference Ministries, 2) Iowa Conference Missions and (3) General (world-wide) Conference Ministries. These funds cover administrative costs so 100% of our mission giving goes directly to the project's or program's work. I think this "mile" is very important.

Mile Two is divided into seven colors of the rainbow. Our N.O.W. goal is to offer opportunities for giving in each of these colors at some time throughout the year.

Red – World Advance projects (\$1 per member) are selected because their locations are in the same areas as some of our Iowa supported missionaries or because of the nature of their programs. A new micro-finance mission we gave to this year is Iowa-Nigeria Partnership's *EmpowHer* which helps Nigerian women by loaning them funds for a business, which they repay, so new loans can be offered to other women.

Orange – United States Projects (\$1 per member) are either UM Advance projects or they have Iowa Missionary connections. One example of our giving in 2010 was to *Kids Against Hunger*, Jasper County, Iowa.

Yellow – UMCOR Projects (\$1 per member). United Methodist Committee on Relief was created in 1940 in response to the suffering of people during WWII. Today, UMCOR is one of the first agencies on the scene when disaster strikes anywhere in the world. And... they are one of the last to leave. Sometimes these are urgent and timely needs, like the 2010 earthquake relief in Haiti.

Green – World Hunger/Poverty (\$6 per member). The name explains the need for more funds in this band of our rainbow. "For I was hungry and you gave me food..." Matthew 25:42a. St Luke gave to several projects in 2010 such as St Andrew's Potato Project, to name just one.

Blue – Iowa Conference Advance Projects (\$1 per member) are located within the state of Iowa. One example of our giving in 2010 was the raising of funds for the *Iowa-Nigeria Partnership Village Wells* program.

Indigo – Parish Development of Iowa UMCongregations (\$1 per member) – The Iowa Conference is committed to helping existing churches

Dear St Luke Family,

It's supposed to be an "honor" to receive one of "those" letters...I guess. It's also a cause for anxiety. Do I have time to give to such a commitment? Do I "want" to get involved in yet one more activity? I just agreed to be on Trinity UMC's Capital Campaign Board.

Did you notice all the "I" words in that paragraph? I hope you don't respond to an invitation like that! Sounds pretty selfish, doesn't it. Have to admit, those were my first thoughts when I received a letter from Iowa Bishop Trimble that Central District Supt Dave Weesner "recommended" me, St Luke actually, for the PATH 1 Leadership Training at 6:30 pm at Oakwood UMC, Pleasant Hill on Thursday, Jan 13.

It's no small challenge. But it's one that is near and dear to the heart of St Luke UMC. Part of the letter reads: Every church in Iowa is struggling with how to get more people, especially younger and more diverse people. It's not uncommon to hear our churches and church members wonder aloud, "Exactly how can we do that?"

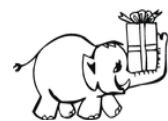
One of the proven best ways to reach these populations is through starting new faith communities. Such new communities include adding an additional worship service (maybe even on a different day and at a different location), off-site or multi-site, micro/house church, ethnic partnership, "church within a church" or "church without walls." The common element in all of these is that of making room for others, and not just physical space, but also room for their life and culture within the life of our churches. So how do you do THAT?

The Iowa UMConference has formed a partnership with the General UMChurch's PATH 1 movement to help us address this very question, and to form a Conference-wide strategy for reaching more people, more younger people, and more diverse people through the multiplication of new faith communities. The goal of PATH 1 is to help annual conferences and local churches identify 1,000 church planters who will start 650 healthy, new congregations in the United States by the end of 2012

These contributions come from the members' pledges. So now we have an empty treasury and are ready to start another year. A Reception Fund from donations for luncheons and receptions is used for camp scholarships & small kitchen incidentals.

revitalize their ministries and to expanding ministry through the establishment of new faith communities. We gave to the *Women at the Well UMC* as part of our Christmas offering.

Purple – Special Offerings (\$1 per member) are World Communion, Peace with Justice, United Methodist Student, Human Relations, Native American Ministries, and One Great Hour of Sharing.

Mile Three goal is to give an additional \$2 per member to United Methodist missionaries and \$1 per member to local projects. In 2010 St Luke gave to missionaries Amy Spaur and Larry and Jane Kies. We share a Covenant Relationship with both Amy and the Kies to provide \$300 annual support to each. We also gave to several local projects.

We are still calculating 2010 numbers but the facts are:

St Luke is a very generous 3rd Mile Congregation.

Check out the Education wing hallway in January for a complete Rainbow Covenant list of St Luke giving. That is where N.O.W. is coming from. Our hope is that you give to the projects that touch your heart and mind. We do not expect for everyone to give to every mission. Even we, as individuals, and as a group, do not do that. Our goal is to offer you options and information so that you can choose who, where and what you would like to support each year. And we are grateful for your support.
